***What is LOT?***

The Leaders of Tomorrow® Program (LOT) is an internationally recognized program under the National Black MBA Association (NBMBAA) umbrella. Its mission is to serve as mentors and resources to minority high school students, improve student academic and leadership skills, and increase their ability to enter *and excel once* in college.

The NBMBAA Indianapolis Chapter’s local implementation of the national LOT Program will achieve its mission by equipping our students to develop leadership skills, serve within their communities, refine their communication skills, increase their financial literacy, plan for college and explore various careers. This is achieved through various workshops and community service events.

## **Registration Information**

### ***Who is eligible?***

The LOT Spring 2022 program is accepting Freshman, Sophomore, Junior and Senior high school students who have a semester GPA of at least 2.0. Please note that participation in National LOT events will be by selection based on pre-determined criteria to be shared during the program.

### ***When is registration?***

The 2022 program begins in January. Students are strongly encouraged to apply as soon as the registration period opens in late November / early December 2021.

**Note:** Applicants may apply after the registration period and be placed on our waiting list for acceptance into the program. Those seniors who are late registrants may not qualify for scholarships due to late registration.

### ***What is the registration fee?***

There is no registration fee at the local level. However, participants may need register with the national LOT program. That annual fee is normally in the \$10-\$15 range.
